The research library contains over 750 volumes, 600 manuscripts, 500 photographs, maps, and documents. With a fine collection of genealogical and architectural materials, the history of Oyster Bay is preserved in a state-of-the-art repository whose exterior design is a tribute to the barns and grist mills that once supported our early farming community.

PUBLIC PROGRAMS

The Garden

The eighteenth century garden was restored by the North Country Garden Club in 1991-1992, and is maintained by their members. Like many gardens of the period, it features herbs used for medicinal purposes, cooking, or for their fragrance.



As one of the oldest surviving houses on Long Island and a Town Landmark, the Earle-Wightman house has witnessed all of Oyster Bay's remarkable history. The home offers three interpreted rooms, a rotating exhibition space, and a gift shop featuring works from Long Island artists and historians.
